Recruitment Ad — Canadian Women's Army Corps

The Canadian Women's Army Corps (CWAC) was established in 1941. While women were not allowed to serve in combat, they were needed to fill support roles so that more men could be freed up to fight.

This recruiting advertisement from 1943 listed some of the jobs women who joined the CWAC could perform.
