

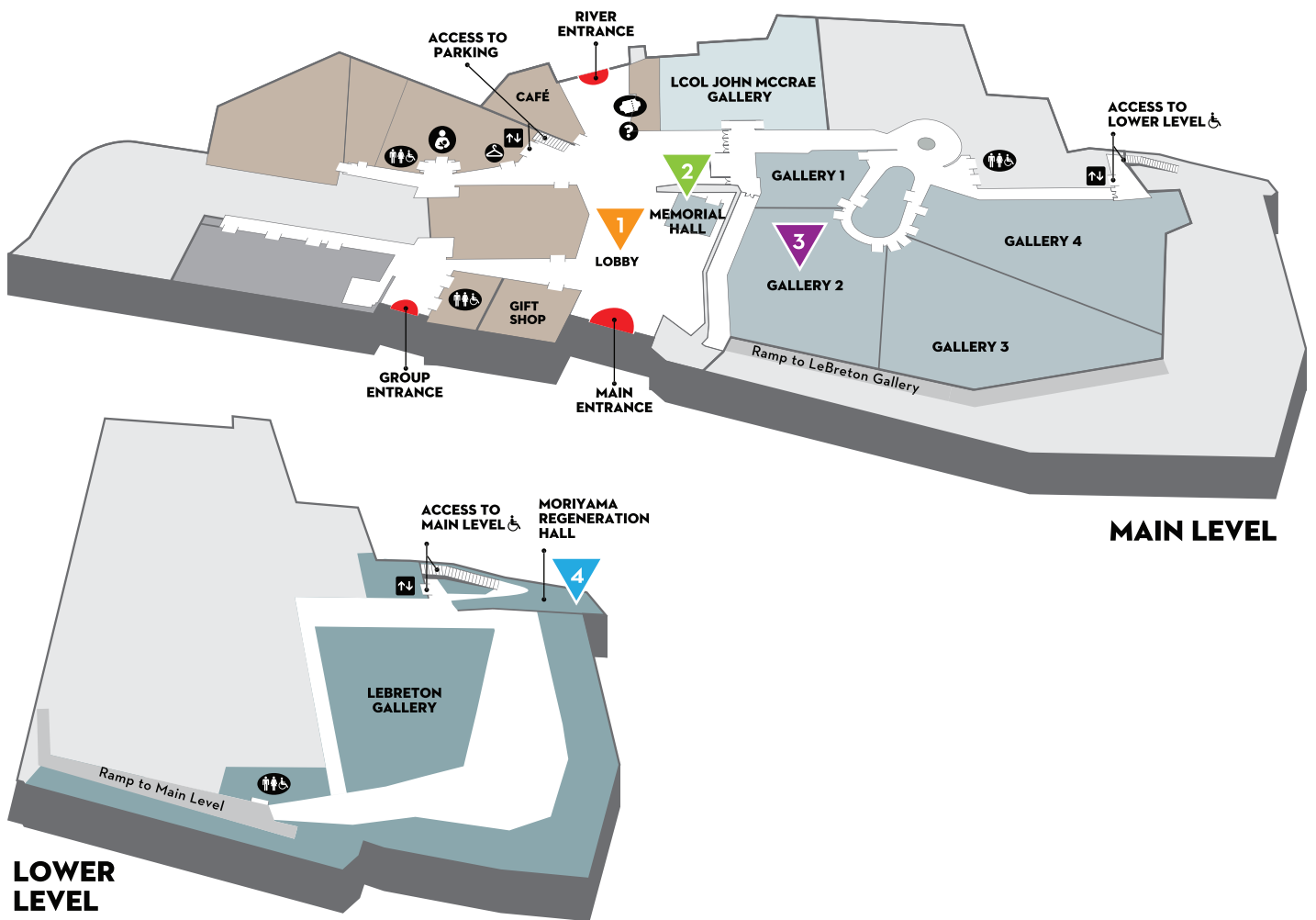
REMEMBRANCE PATH

Follow the Museum’s Remembrance Path, and discover how the message of remembrance is shared through artifacts, personal stories and even the architecture of the Canadian War Museum itself.

This self-guided tour will take you through several galleries in the Museum. The tour will take you approximately 45 minutes.

The Remembrance Path is laid out on the map below. Inside the Museum, each stop is indicated by a large poppy.
